

# Collaborative Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) Policy

#### 1. COMPLIANCE OBLIGATION SUPPORTED

<u>Admission and enrolment (Higher Degree by Research) Rules Made Pursuant to Statute 12 – Admission and Enrolment</u>

### 2. PURPOSE

2.1. To set out clear principles governing <u>Collaborative PhDs</u> including <u>Joint Award</u>, <u>Dual Award</u> and Cotutelle PhD programs.

### 3. POLICY STATEMENT

- 3.1. Curtin University supports Collaborative PhDs with quality Partner Institutions in order to grow research collaboration.
- 3.2. Collaborative PhDs are encouraged where there is evidence of:
  - (a) an existing collaboration between researchers at Curtin and the Partner Institution; and/or
  - (b) where such a collaboration would build a sustainable research collaboration; and
  - (c) where the collaboration is an area of strategic importance and scale.
- 3.3. The Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Research or Delegate will assess all new requests for Collaborative PhDs.
- 3.4. All Collaborative PhDs will be covered by an Agreement signed by the delegated officer in each university. The Agreement will cover:
  - (a) Admission; Supervision; Candidacy or equivalent; Ethics; Intellectual Property; Language of the Thesis, Submission and Examination; Award; and
  - (b) Financial arrangements with regard to Tuition Fees, Scholarship Stipends, Health Cover and Travel Expenses; and
  - (c) Complaints and Misconduct; and Dispute Resolution.
- 3.5. Admission and enrolment (Higher Degree by Research) Rules Made Pursuant to Statute 12 Admission and Enrolment will be adhered to except where specific arrangements are detailed in the Agreement.

#### 4. SCOPE OF POLICY

This policy applies to all Collaborative PhDs where students are enrolled in a PhD degree at Curtin, including Curtin global campuses, and at an approved Partner Institution. It does not apply to arrangements where there is collaborative supervision but enrolment in a PhD degree at only one institution.

### 5. **DEFINITIONS**

(Note: Commonly defined terms are located in the <u>Curtin Common Definitions</u>. Any defined terms below are specific to this document)

# **Collaborative PhD**

Collaborative PhD means a Doctor of Philosophy degree jointly supervised by staff at Curtin University and at a Partner Institution where the student is enrolled at both institutions.

#### **Dual Award**

Dual Award means two qualifications and two testamurs conferred separately by two institutions for two programs of study.

#### Joint Award

Joint Award means a single qualification which can take the form of one or two testamurs, jointly conferred by the collaborating institutions for a joint program of study.

## Partner Institution

Partner Institution means a degree awarding institution within Australia or overseas that is collaborating with Curtin in a Collaborative PhD Program.
